How to do makeup for FVAD performances

Makeup at FVAD is very basic and optional.

Instructions for Pre-School, Ballet Prep, Ballet 1 Fnd, Ballet 1 & Ballet 2 performers

• No makeup necessary.

Instructions for Ballet 3-6 performances [JUNIOR MAKEUP]

- Makeup is optional
- Optionally apply a light dusting of face powder (so the skin is not shiny).
- If desired, apply a small amount of eye shadow and lipstick.
- No mascara or eyeliner needed.
- NO FALSE EYELASHES

Instructions for Ballet 7-11 performers [SENIOR MAKEUP]

Foundation

Optional: With a damp sponge, apply pancake or cream foundation over entire face including under the jawbone until skin tone and coloring are even.

Loose Powder

• With a puff, face powder is applied over the face to set the foundation and keep face from being shiny.

Eye Shadow

- White or Cream (highlight color) is applied to the eyelids and the area below the brow.
- Pink, Rose or Wine (accent color) is applied to the space between the highlight color and eyelashes.
- Brown (contour color) is applied to the crease, or the narrow space between the top of the eyelash and the bone above, to give the eyes more depth.
- Use colors in the brown and wine tones for the most natural look.
- Avoid strong blues or greens.
- All colors should then be blended slightly upward and out to soften the look.

Eveliner

- The liner may be applied on the eyelid above the lashes close to the lash line.
- Repeat for the lower lashes (optional). Lines need not extend outward past the eye.

Eyelashes

- Black mascara may be applied to both the top and the bottom of the lashes.
- NO FALSE EYELASHES

<u>Blush</u>

Apply lightly on the cheekbone (from the apple of the cheek to the hairline)

Lipstick

- Use plum shades of lipstick rather than reds for better effect under theatre lighting.
- Generally, the color should be a shade darker than your natural lip color.
- Once the lip color is applied, blot well with tissues to remove excess and avoid smearing.
